HOW SKIS ARE TESTED

First, representatives from the skiing industry (product managers) specify categories and specifications. Each manufacturer then decides in which categories and with which models he wishes to start. Within each category all models are tested on the same course based on the following criteria: carve factor, comfort, edge grip, speed capacity, versatility and maneuverability, etc. Each test person records his or her experiences and evaluations on a test card. All data is then collected and evaluated independently under notarial supervision.

With her World Cup victories in the Super-G discipline in Sestriere and Bormio, this sympathetic skier from Canton Schwyz finally climbed to the top international ranks. At age 23 she has ambitious plans in this circus of top skiers.

ANDREJ JERMAN

Following his successful weekend in Garmisch-Partenkirchen in the 2006/07 season (1st and 2nd places in the downhill), the Slovene continued his seamless performance into the World Cup 2007/08. His season was crowned by a podium place in Chamonix and by several top ten placements.



TOBIAS GRÜNENFELDER

This team veteran has a habit of skiing onto podium places and into top ten placements. Last Winter the 31-year-old skier from Canton Glarus proved his skills by finishing 5th in the Lake Louise downhill.



TINA MAZE

By committing Tina Maze we successfully gained a top racer on our team. So far in her career the 25-year-old Slovene has already stood on the podium twelve times in the World Cup, six of which marked victories. She celebrated her last World Cup victory this past season in the St. Moritz downhill.



CORNEL ZÜGER

The past season was the most successful in the career of this 27-year-old skier. He celebrated no less than four placements under the top 30 in the World Cup downhills, including the 24th place in Kitzbühel.



MONIKA DUMERMUTH

This Bernese racer can boast of strong World Cup experience, and has celebrated several top rankings in the past. Her favorite disciplines are downhill and Super-G, as illustrated by her successful 2007/08 season in which she finished twice under the first ten in downhill.



MARKUS VOGEL

This 24-year-old skier from Beckenried gathered some valuable experiences in initial World Cup slalom events in the 2007/08 season. By optimally applying these skills in the European Cup and FIS races he was able to win four races in the last season.



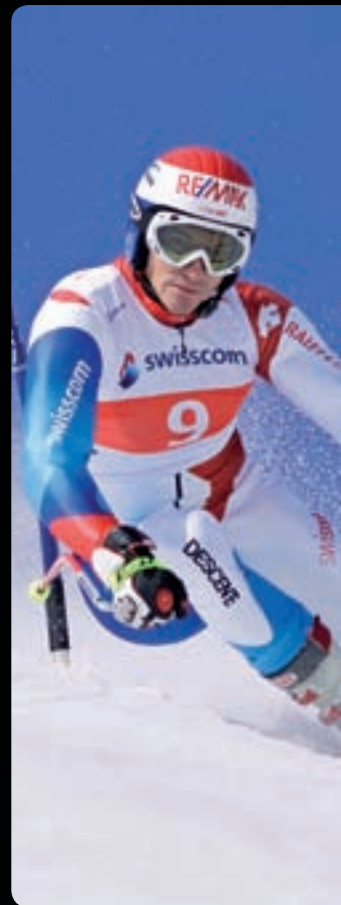
ANDREA DETTLING

Several victories in the European Cup and FIS races promise this young talent a successful future. Thanks to her European Cup score the 21-year-old talent is waiting in the wings to ski in the first World Cup races.



OLIVIER BRAND

In the last season, this Genevan ski racer won the European Cup score in Super-G and thus secured a fixed starting position in the World Cup season 2008/09. The 25th place in the Super-G race in Kvitfjell this past season is the best World Cup result so far.

ROCK 'N' ROLL

MIKE SCHMID

Mike dominated the Crossmax series in the past season and also landed several podium places in the World Cup. After last year's streak of bad luck with injuries, he is prepared to launch a full throttle attack this year.



STANLEY HAYER

A newcomer on the Stöckli team, this 35-year-old Canadian is an ace in his field. Highlights of his past season include a 7th place in the Overall World Cup standing and a silver medal at the World Skicross Championships.



EMILIE SERAIN

This 24-year-old Swiss lady from Western Switzerland is new on the Stöckli team. World Cup podium places, Swiss Championship titles and Top Ten placements at the X-games make up the greatest successes in her still very young career.



AUDON GRØNVOLD

An interesting new face on the Stöckli Skicross Team is Audon Grønvdal, a Norwegian who won the Overall World Cup Skicross in 2007. Additional podium places in skicross as well as in the Alpine World Cup complete his winner rankings so far.



RICHARD SPALINGER

The last season witnessed the experienced Stöckli Skicross Team celebrating Richard Spalinger's recruitment into the national team. At age 33, he is not anywhere near to being written off because of age – as demonstrated impressively by his regular victories and podium places.



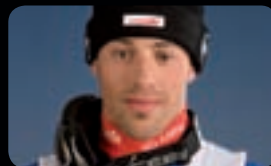
ALOIS MANI
